So...Where's Your Stole?

Some of you have noticed, and a few of you have asked: why don't I wear a stole like Pastor Doug and Pastor Bill? It's a good question. (And it's not just that I forgot to buy one or put it on!) The is a piece of colored fabric that most pastors wear around their necks to match the colors of the liturgical season. It's not primarily an accessory but a symbol of authority given to pastors at their ordination. It's meant to resemble a yoke. And the simple answer is that I'm not ordained yet.

I joke sometimes that they don't call us Methodists for nothing--there is a method to everything! The process toward ordained ministry is no different. This past Annual Conference, just before I started at WUMC, I was commissioned as a provisional elder in the UMC. I am pursuing ordination as an elder, which means I am commissioned and hope to be ordained to a ministry of Word, Sacrament, Order, and Service. (Or in less churchy terms: to preach and teach, celebrate baptism and Communion, and lead the church in making disciples and in serving our world.) To be commissioned, candidates earn a Master of Divinity degree, write a series of essays (on theology, leadership, worship, spiritual disciplines, and personal character), and interview several times with team of clergy and laypeople on the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. I began this process in 2008 when I started seminary and officially began the ordination process in 2011. So it's been a long journey!

Since beginning my ministry here, I have begun participating in a two-year process called Residency in Ordained Ministry. I meet monthly with a cohort of other new pastors across the Annual Conference and a mentor, read books on leadership, theology, and ministry, and talk regularly with an experienced pastor who serves as my "coach," and reflect and write on topics like leading change in the church, preaching and teaching, racial reconciliation, and building a support system.

This coming summer, I will begin the final steps toward ordination. I will write a final set of essays, reflecting on everything from theology and leadership to self-care, health, and personal finances. I will be evaluated on preaching and worship leadership by my team on the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. I will also be writing and leading a Bible study this fall and leading a project to help our church make disciples. (More info to come on those last items later!) Then I will meet with a team of our conference's Board of Ordained Ministry next April to interview and discern my readiness for ordination and my effectiveness as a pastor. If I am approved, then I will be ordained in full connection at Annual Conference in June 2018—and finally be presented with the long-awaited stole!

In United Methodist, we describe ourselves as a connectional system. I am grateful that I am not in this process alone--but have the opportunity to discern my call to ordained ministry alongside others who can encourage me, challenge me, and keep me sane. I am grateful to be in a denomination that values learning and calls us to the highest standards as we lead the church and follow Christ. I am grateful to be in a denomination that invites me into relationships with others and reminds me that I am not an island. And I am tremendously grateful for each of you!



Stephen Ministry by Beth Perry

It's that time of year again to begin thinking about the training class for Stephen Ministers that will start in September. We currently have 20 active Stephen Ministers. Not all of them have care receivers though we know that at any time we could have several referrals.

Female care receivers are always matched with female Stephen Ministers. Male care receivers are also matched with male Stephen Ministers. We currently have four active male Stephen Ministers. If you are a male who has considered becoming a Stephen Minister, we would love to talk to you.

The training consists of 50 hours which takes place over the course of six months. We meet on Tuesday evenings with time off for Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. There is also one Saturday session which usually takes place early in November.

WUMC coordinates with seven other churches to train our Stephen Ministers together at the Baptist Activity Center on Independence Blvd. This lightens the load on each church and encourages a sense of community within the Stephen Ministries of all the churches.

You will be hearing more about this from me as well as the pastors. Please prayerfully consider whether Stephen Ministry might be calling you to service in a new and rewarding way.



Surgery to Begin at Rotifunk Hospital

In early February, Dr. Richard Morrison, Dr. Sam Spicer and Dale Smith traveled to Sierra Leone with several goals in mind. First, to make input into the 2017 hospital budget process including the desire to open the Operating Room. Second, to emphasize the need to strengthen financial controls and implement a professional accounting system and accurate statistical reporting system. Third, to visit two other hospitals in Sierra Leone to learn from their experiences. Fourth, to collect ideas for developing a sustainability plan for the hospital. This includes the requirement that all patients be required to pay for their services. We are pleased to report that the trip, along with some follow up, achieved all four goals.

Everyone we met and worked with were very warm, supportive and open. One of the highlights was the opportunity to meet with the Rotifunk Hospital Health Board. This was a very impressive group of professional and business leaders. Each of them has committed to make personal contributions to the hospital. We also learned that Rotifunk Haugesund will complete construction of a solar power system for the hospital next month. The following is from Pastor Christina:

"While I was in Rotifunk, I had the chance to visit the prenatal clinic. Expectant mothers waited in line outside the hospital to be seen by nurses and midwives. Some of the women had traveled five to seven miles to be there to receive prenatal vitamins and antibiotics, receive screenings, and get the fetal heart tested. As I talked to them, I realized that many of them had lost a child. Most of them were early to the clinic, seated outside. One very pregnant woman, name Matu, asked me a question through the nurse. She asked, "I have a question for you, Reverend. Do you want to sing a song in English for some pregnant ladies while they wait?" So I sang the first song that came to mind: "I'll Fly Away." And then this woman said, "Reverend, I have another question for you. Would you like for some ladies to sing a song while we're waiting?" They not only sang, but they rose to their feet. They clapped and even danced a little, some of them eight or nine months pregnant. They sang in Krio, but in English it would go like this: Thank you, thank you, thank you. I will tell Papa God, thank you. For what he's done for me, I will tell Papa God thank you."
